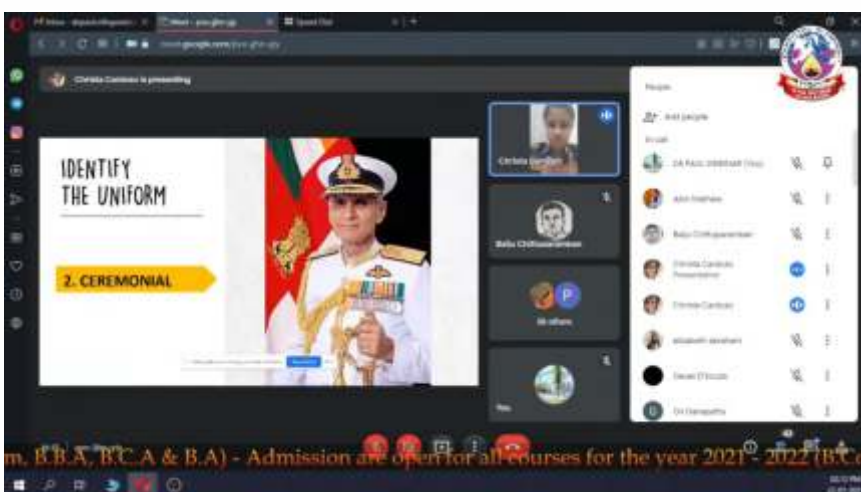


BOOK RELEASE

NATIONAL WEBINAR ON GST

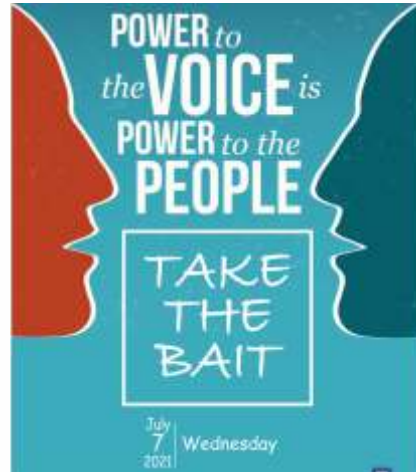
